Debriefing	<p>Kerri Harris provided an overview of the Pullman Melbourne on the Park and its location in the heart of Melbourne with multi-modal public transport options, culture and events.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>ICTH Dates - 4-8 November 2019</b></li><li>• <b>Hotel Block</b> - negotiated nightly rate (includes breakfast and WiFi)</li><li>• <b>Conference Venue</b> – complimentary pending the catering minimum</li><li>• <b>Audio Visual Equipment</b> - separate contract available from an outside vendor.
